### FREE FALL YARD WASTE PICKUP

It's time for our annual fall yard waste pickup. Now's the time to get rid of the fallen leaves and your properties looking great before winter! The date is Saturday, December 5, from 8am until noon. NOTE: ALL ITEMS MUST BE CURBSIDE BEFORE 8am!

HERE'S WHAT'S ALLOWED - all waste must be in biodegradable bags or barrels that can be dumped, limbs & branches (must be bundled together no longer than 48" and 18" round.)

HERE'S WHAT IS NOT ALLOWED - yard waste in plastic bags, garbage/trash bags weighing over 75 pounds each, railroad ties. NOTE: limbs/branches not bundled will not be picked up.

# Here's Some Neighborhood Information You Should Know


YARD WASTE AND LEAVES - Please note that it is a violation of St. Joseph city ordinances to blow or deposit leaves or other yard waste into a storm sewer opening. Failure to comply may result in a ticket and fine.

REPORTING A STREET POTHOLE OR DEFECT - Please remember that the Stonecrest Homes Association does not maintain the streets in our neighborhood. That's the responsibility of the City of St. Joseph. If you know of a pothole in your area, please report it to the city. Encourage your neighbors to do the same. Simply go to this city website and fill out the online form:


TREE LIMBS OVER STREETS & SIDEWALKS - Keep in mind that no tree in St. Joseph may have limbs or branches that hang over a city street or sidewalk any lower than 14 feet from the street/sidewalk surface. Property owners are responsible to trim and maintain their trees' branches so they are at least 14 feet above the surface of the street and/or sidewalk. # $ext{THE}$ FFICE UPDATE Reported By Jane Hausman, Secretary

**DUES:** Annual home association dues collections for the June 2020/May 2021 year are coming in at a good pace. With just over 600 properties in the Stonecrest Homes Association over 550 properties have paid their dues. All dues became "past due" after July 30th, 2020. If you have not yet paid your

\$65 annual dues, please do this. Payments can be mailed to the office or for your convenience, payment can also be made using PayPal on the SHA website at: www.stonecresthomesassoc.com.

E-MAIL ADDRESSES: The office has increased the residential owners' email database by over 300 homes. This was achieved by property owners filling out the lower portion of the green dues payment postcard that was sent out in May and returning the portion requesting their email addresses. Thank you for doing this! This allows the office to send out notices of meetings, events, etc. that affect you. If you have not sent your email address to the office, please do so now on our website under "CONTACT US"!

**RESTRICTION VIOLATIONS:** Reporting of restriction violations have been down over the past year with 23 violation being reported on, personally investigated, and then addressed with the resident. Most violations involve trailers & boats on driveways, yard maintenance, and general appearance of the property. If a restriction violation is noticed by a resident, a Restriction Violation form can be filled out on the website and sent to the office.

CONSTRUCTION APPROVAL FORMS: If you are planning on doing a construction project(s), you need to go to the website and fill out the Construction Approval Form prior to starting your project. Once the form is received the project will be taken under advisement by the board and you will be notified of the results. This past year the board received 14 approval forms with 9 being approved, 1 not approved, and 4 only being inquiries into whether the property owner needed approval for a given project.




